£25 could pay for a blind or partially sighted child to go on a day trip or experience an activity that, without specialist support, wouldn't otherwise be possible

£100 could give visually impaired adults the chance to take part in a group social activity in their local area, helping them to feel less isolated and more involved in their community.

By the time he was three months old, Max had undergone several operations to remove the natural lenses in his eyes and he now has to wear external contact lenses. Max has made amazing progress, but there is still a long road ahead.

Vista's family support officer, Paula, has provided much needed help and reassurance to Max and his family throughout his treatment.

Paula has been brilliant, and has shown us the wide range of services the charity has to offer to young people. It's really encouraging to know that Vista will be there, helping Max as he gets older, and it's great to see the opportunities that will be available to him in the future. I recently took part in a Super Hero Fun Run for Vista, which was a great way of raising money as well as awareness for a really important charity that we are so pleased is there.

### Hold an event


Quiz nights, family fun days, pamper parties, fancy dress days, auctions or balls are all excellent ways to raise money and get people involved.

# Planning your activity

We're here to help you step by step.

### Fix a date and plan carefully

Pick a date that gives you plenty of time to prepare, and create a timeline to help you plan. Check that event doesn't clash with any other activities in your area – you don't want to be competing for the limelight! Create a budget to help you keep track of what you spend and set a target to aim for – it will feel amazing when you reach it!

### **Ask for help**

Recruit a team of family and friends to help you. Give everyone a specific job so you know that everything is taken care of. Also, consider seeking sponsorship and donations in return for publicity or free tickets.

### **Get online**

Set up an online giving page at justgiving.com/vista so that your family, friends and colleagues can support you. Don't forget to share your page with as many people as possible through email and social media.

### **Spread the word**

Remember to mention Vista as

much as you can, and tell people why you're raising money for the charity. Social networks like Facebook and Twitter are a great way to promote your activity amongst family and friends, and you can also get in touch with your local newspaper and radio station to see if they will cover your event. We can send you posters, press release templates, event materials and provide advice to help you get your message out there – just get in touch.

#### Have fun

Enjoy yourself! Fundraising should be fun – the more fun you have the more people are likely to donate. Don't forget to take lots of photos - you can use these on social networks and in local media to raise a bit more money after the event.

### Keeping it safe and legal

Simple things you can do to ensure everything runs smoothly. If you want to hold a public collection, you'll need to make sure you get the appropriate permission beforehand. For street collections, ask your local



authority, or get in touch with the owner if the collection will take place on private land.

Raffles have complex rules and regulations, so please contact us if you are thinking of organising one. If you're organising a raffle and selling tickets to the general public, you'll need to contact your local authority to secure a licence.

First aid is important to make sure your event is safe. Your local Red Cross or St John Ambulance can

provide advice about the type of first aid you may need.

If your event involves the public, you'll need to make sure you have Public Liability Insurance. Your venue may have adequate insurance to cover your event, and household insurance is likely to cover an event at your home, but please check and contact us for advice if you're not sure.

Some venues will already have a license to sell or supply alcohol, and play recorded music. If not, you will need to contact your local authority to get one.

### The money you've raised

Whenever you're counting and handling money, always try to make sure that two people are present. Take care when transporting money and try and bank cash as soon as possible. We can provide you with sealed collection boxes to help keep your money secure.
