

Disability related Expenditure (DRE) Frequently Asked Questions

Proposed changes to Leicester City Council's financial assessment for adults who live at home and are eligible for help from adult social care

What is Disability Related Expenditure?	Everyone who is eligible for adult social care has a financial assessment to work out if they have to pay towards the cost of their care. The financial assessment takes into account extra expenses people may have because of their disability. This is called Disability Related Expenditure. This may include gas or electricity usage, additional water usage, travel costs, community alarms, gardening and dietary needs.
How long is the consultation running for?	The consultation will go live from 3 July 2018 to 28 September 2018.
Why does the council want to make changes	We are proposing to change the amount allowed for disability related expenditure per week to bring it in line with the average cost of such expenditure in Leicester and to make it fairer. It means that everyone is treated the same, whether they are single or part of a couple. This would help the Council spend its money more wisely so that as many people as possible can get help.
How does DRE work now?	Currently we allow a minimum amount of £20 per week towards disability related expenditure for a single person (or £15 per week, for one of a couple). We do allow people more than the set amount, if they can show that their expenses are higher.
What does the council want to change?	We want to change the amount for disability related expenditure so that a minimum of £10 per week is allowed for everyone. We have worked out that on average most people in Leicester have disability related expenses of £7.50 per week, and so reducing the amount to a minimum of £10 per week is closer to what people actually spend. We think this proposal is fairer.
If these changes are agreed what changes will people see?	If this change is agreed, almost half of the people (49%) that are eligible for adult social care are unlikely to see any change at all. They will either pay nothing as they do now, or will continue to pay the same amount each week.

	Whilst many people will not be asked to pay more, some people will be. Some people could start paying for the first time.			
	The highest increase anyone would have to pay is £10 per week.			
If the proposals are agreed	Any changes would be introduced from April 2019, at the next financial assessment or review.
